

Kia ora tātou,

Working together for a greater impact on New Zealand

New Zealand society is not in great shape, spiritually or morally. Many churches are also not doing especially well. In our own way, and in our own places, we all work to help change that.

Normally, we write about other things, beyond NZCN. <u>New Zealand Christian</u> <u>Network</u>, however, was set up in 2002 by a wide range of church leaders to help Christians work together, to strengthen and resource the body of Christ, and to speak constructively into New Zealand society with biblical grace and truth.

NZCN is a mainly voluntary network (our very small and highly dedicated staff team are all part-time), is remarkably cost-effective, has a respected and trusted voice, and is steadily growing.

Our free NZCN News, with short articles on issues in church and society, is greatly appreciated by many. We always aim to be biblically faithful, fair-minded, reasoned, and gracious. Our views are sometimes picked up by media, like this.

We also run a weekly national on-line prayer gathering (<u>PrayAsOne</u>), help organise regional Prayer Breakfasts, plan to run another New Zealand Christian Leaders' Congress (in 2023), and have resources to offer (e.g. the *Te Rongopai* documentary, now available on-line <u>here</u>).

NZCN does not exist for itself. It exists solely as a servant ministry to New Zealand's Christians, churches, and society.

- 2. When this anxiety leads Christians into increased boldness and earnestness in prayer.
- 3. Pastors and church leaders begin to pray together and ask themselves, "What must we do?"
- 4. When we see the doctrine of the individual responsibility of each Christian fully felt and carried out with individual action.


PRAYER POINTS:

- **Pray that God would give you** eyes to see what He sees and to fill you with compassion for the broken, the lost, the bound, and the despairing in our land.
- Repent on behalf of our nation and of the church of our nation. Ask him to show you where you have become indifferent and cold to the needs and eternal destiny of your friends and neighbours.
- Pray for a fresh outpouring in our land, a new zeal and boldness to come upon the church, and for the good news about Jesus Christ to be repeatedly shared.
- **Pray for the Holy Spirit to sweep through our land** with a fresh earnestness in prayer.
- **Pray that church leaders would begin praying together** as never before leading to churches reaching out and serving their communities together.
- **Commit yourself afresh** to take responsibility to stir up the gifts He has given you so you may aspire to the impossible as He enables you.
