

Important update: New Zealand Christian Leaders' Congress (19-21 September)

It's now just under three months until the New Zealand Christian Leaders' Congress. The Congress begins at 5.00 p.m. on Tuesday 19 September and runs through to 4.00 p.m. on Thursday 21 September.

This unique and significant event is for Christian leaders from across Aotearoa New Zealand, including denominational leaders, pastors, and other leaders and staff in both churches and other Christian ministries. The New Zealand Christian Leaders' Congress, which is co-ordinated by the New Zealand Christian Network, takes places only every few years. And this is the year!

The Congress will be an excellent opportunity for Christian leaders from many different places, cultures, denominations, types of churches, and Christian organisations to explore together the challenges and opportunities for Christianity in our current New Zealand contexts. It will be a time for stimulus, inspiration, prayer, shared worship, fellowship and networking.

A New Zealand focus, and New Zealand speakers

We are deliberately focusing on New Zealand issues, and on New Zealand contributors. There will be a wide range of voices and presenters. Speakers will have brief time limits, so as to allow time for panels, group discussion, and prayer.

Themes

Topic areas will be covered through a mix of plenary sessions, streams, and electives. These include (though there will be more, especially in electives) ...

- ideas/ideologies now shaping New Zealand
- restoring confidence in the Gospel
- navigating sexuality and gender issues with both grace and truth
- effective evangelism in today's context
- · winning, retaining, and mobilising all generations
- re-gearing and renewing churches for today
- the leadership crisis
- renewal and revival
- Christians and bi-culturalism
- Christianity and Pasifika people in New Zealand
- Christianity and Asian people in New Zealand
- responding to sexual abuse in churches
- keeping our own house in order: good church governance and practice
- Christianity and the care of God's creation
- Christianity and social justice

The venue

This year, for the first time ever, the Congress is being held in Auckland. We are very pleased to announce that the venue will be the Aukilani Community Church, 96 Lansford Crescent, Avondale. Formerly the Liberty Centre, this is now a Samoan Assembly of God church. This excellent venue has large capacity, a dining hall, many break-out rooms, extensive parking, is close to motorways and train and bus routes, and has a range of accommodation options in surrounding suburbs. NZ Christian Leaders' Congress


19-21 September in Auckland



REBUILDING TRUST | POPULISTS, ELITISTS, AND THE FUTURE OF OUR DEMOCRACY




Trust has declined steadily in the developed world over some decades; more sharply in recent years.
